2-Week Course

This is a two-week program where you'll focus on one course for the entire duration.

Program Highlights

- **Basic Drafting Skills:** Begin your journey into basic drafting skills, understanding that everyone starts somewhere.
- **Developing Design Concepts:** Hone your ability to develop unique and compelling design concepts.
- **Dynamic Color Scheme Creation:** Learn the art of putting together dynamic and aesthetically pleasing color schemes.
- **Furniture and Material Selection:** Gain expertise in choosing the right furniture and materials to achieve the desired look for a space.
- **Guest speakers or Onsite Visits:** Embark on virtual or onsite visits to showrooms and design shops in NYC, the nation's design capital.
- **Pre-College I: Designing a Small Apartment:** Engage in interactive sessions to design a small apartment as part of your Pre-College I experience.
- **Pre-College II: Crafting Hospitality Spaces:** Explore the art of crafting hospitality spaces, such as hotel lobbies or small cafes, to expand your design portfolio.



Academic Program Overview

Interior Design 1 (Pre-College I):

- Foundations of Interior Design:
 - Acquire fundamental interior design skills while completing a residential design project.
 - Develop drafting skills, interpret floor plans, and create design concepts, color schemes, and furniture/material selections.
 - Experience the real-world aspect by visiting design showrooms and the offices of professional interior designers in New York.
 - Apply your newfound knowledge to design a New York City apartment.

Interior Design 2 (Pre-College II):

- Advanced Interior Design Techniques:
 - Elevate your interior design expertise by undertaking the challenge of designing a café and hotel lobby.
 - Learn to navigate the complexities of designing public spaces and collaborating with clients.
 - Pre-College I is a prerequisite for enrolling in this advanced course.

Earn College Credits: Seize the chance to earn one college credit applicable towards an undergraduate degree at NYSID or for inclusion in your future college applications.



Excursions

Visit showrooms, commercial design firms, and various design centers. Engage in hands-on work within a studio setting, and have the opportunity to hear insights from professionals in the field.

Course Structure

There are two class sessions per day over the two-week course. During week one, students have class from 9:30am-12:30pm and 1:30pm-3:30pm Monday - Friday. During week two students have class from 9:30am-12:30pm and 1:30pm-3:30pm Monday through Thursday. Students will embark on 3-4 academic excursions as well, typically during a morning class session.
