## 2-Week Course

This is a two-week program where you'll focus on one course for the entire duration.

## Program Highlights

- Develop practical clinical skills including taking vitals, recording patient histories, first aid, suturing, and get child & infant CPR and AED certified.
- Work in teams to research, diagnose, and develop a treatment plan for simulated pediatric patients
- Perform basic pediatric patient care for general, emergency, and hospital medicine patient cases.

## Academic Program Overview

Does your budding physician have an interest in diagnosing, treating, and caring for adolescents, children, and infants? Pediatricians are trained to diagnose, treat, and help prevent diseases and injuries for children from infancy to young adulthood. While they perform many similar tasks to that of a general physician, pediatricians are specially trained in diagnosing and treating problems specific to young patients. In this program, students will explore the specialty field of pediatric medicine. They will practice conducting patient physical examinations, triaging pediatric emergency and hospital medicine cases, taking patient histories, and get infant and adolescent CPR/AED certified.



## Excursions

Students have toured the pediatric ward at Chan-Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital. They have also had the opportunity to visit the UCSF KANBAR Center for Simulation and Clinical Skills to get practical hands on experience.

## Instructors

### Berkeley - UCSF Pediatric Physicians

This program will be taught by Pediatric Resident physicians currently in their residency program at the UCSF Medical Center, one of the nation's top-ranked non-profit hospitals. The program is being coordinated by pediatricians, Dr. Eisha Jain, MD, MPH, UCSF and Dr. Jessica Mecklosky, MD, UCSF. The program's curriculum advisor is Dr. Amy Whittle, Clinical Professor of Pediatrics, Associate Medical Director, Integrated Care, Children's Health Center, SFGH Pediatric Residency Rotation Director for "Physician in Community" and "Behavior & Development", University of California, San Francisco.

## Course Structure

There are nine 3-hour class sessions over the two-week course. During week one, students have class from 9am-12pm, Monday - Friday. During week two students have class from 9am-12pm Monday through Thursday. Wednesday afternoons are dedicated to additional academic time (excursions, speakers).

## Academic Program Overview

Are you interested in diagnosing, treating and caring for children, adolescents and infants? Pediatricians are trained to prevent, diagnose and treat illnesses and injuries in patients from infancy through young adulthood. While they perform many of the same tasks as general physicians, pediatricians focus on the unique needs of young patients.

In this program, students will explore the specialty of pediatric medicine. They'll practice conducting physical exams, triaging pediatric emergency and hospital cases, taking patient histories and earning certification in infant and adolescent CPR and AED.



## Excursions

Students have toured Yale New Haven Children's Hospital, a nationally ranked pediatric facility with dedicated units for cancer, cardiology, neonatology and other specialties. They've also had the opportunity to visit the Yale Center for Healthcare Simulation, a state-of-the-art facility where they can observe and participate in pediatric simulation scenarios, including newborn care, pediatric emergency simulations and clinical skills training using advanced mannequin-based simulators.
