1-Week Course

This course is one week long, and you can extend your experience to as many as six weeks by adding additional one-week courses.



Program Highlights

- Explore surgical specialties and gain exposure to procedures ranging from orthopedics to neurosurgery
- Practice suturing, applying sterile technique and using surgical instruments safely
- Learn how surgical teams operate, follow protocols and manage procedures in the OR
- Use training models to practice basic procedures and build clinical decision-making skills

Academic Program Overview

Get an inside look at the world of surgery and what it takes to pursue a career in the field. This program introduces core surgical concepts, hands-on skill development and exposure to a variety of specialties. You'll explore surgical career paths while gaining insight into the precision, teamwork and commitment that define surgical medicine.

Designed for students exploring medical careers, the program offers a realistic introduction to surgical training and practice. Through interactive exercises and mentorship from practicing surgeons, you'll get a clearer sense of whether surgical medicine aligns with your interests and goals. Every student also earns CPR/AED certification.



Excursions

Students have toured the Yale Center for Healthcare Simulation, a state-of-the-art facility where they observe and practice surgical techniques using advanced simulators, including laparoscopic and robotic surgery trainers. They've also visited simulation rooms designed to replicate real clinical settings such as operating rooms, trauma bays and emergency departments, gaining hands-on experience with surgical procedures and clinical decision-making in a controlled environment.

Students may also explore the Surgical Simulation Center at Yale School of Medicine, which features equipment for practicing minimally invasive surgical skills and endoscopic procedures.
