Student Life

Students live and study on one of the greenest urban campuses in the U.S. Georgia Tech is known for its blend of modern facilities, historic buildings, and innovation in public spaces. Surrounded by nature yet in the heart of the city, students have the best of both worlds. They enjoy their free time by exploring both the communal indoor and outdoor spaces as well as the diverse array of restaurants, shops, cafes, and dessert spots around Georgia Tech. There are numerous fields and open areas where students can hang out and play games, including popular sand volleyball courts.



Lodging and Meals

Students will be housed in a comfortable, air-conditioned building featuring in-suite rooms. Each room includes an extra-long twin-sized bed, a desk and chair, a wardrobe, and a dresser. Bathrooms are in-suite and typically shared among four students. Mentors live on the same floors as the students and are available to assist with any needs. Dorms are ideally located near a sand volleyball court, close to the dining hall, centrally positioned on campus, and just a 15-minute walk to classes. Students have access to free laundry facilities, vending machines, a courtyard, and common lounge areas, making it a great place to relax. Students will have their three daily meals either in the dining hall or off-campus.



College Readiness Workshops

All students participate in a rotation of workshops designed to engage youth with various skills for a successful transition to college. The workshop sessions cover Speaking with Confidence, Mastering Money, Developing Leadership, and Prepping for College and Career. Led by experienced instructors, these workshops provide a solid foundation to help students navigate their future academic and career endeavors.
