Student Life

Based in the heart of Washington D.C., students have the opportunity to enjoy visits to an array of iconic museums, government buildings and monuments, along with stopping for a bite to eat at any of the diverse and delicious restaurants the quaint town of Georgetown has to offer.



Lodging and Meals

Students share a dorm room with roommates and share a common bathroom, floors are gender segregated. A Resident Advisor will be just down the hall for anything you might need.

Leo O'Donovan dining Hall (Leo's) is within walking distance of the residence halls, allowing students to interact with their fellow students and get a taste of college life. Leo's offers breakfast, lunch, and dinner daily and accommodates a variety of dietary restrictions such as vegetarian, vegan, gluten-free, kosher, halal, or specific food allergies.



Afternoon Labs

In the afternoons, the middle school students participate in academic labs that will give them time to tinker on their course projects or work on a hands-on project that will bring their learning to life.



Requirements

- Middle School Program: Students must be between the ages of 11-13 and have finished 6th grade
- A grade point average of 3.0 (or equivalent)
