Residential Students

- **Includes:** all meals, lodging, excursions, academic course, weekend excursions
- **Excludes:** optional airport pickup and drop off service (available for an additional fee)
- **Price:** \$5,498 first week \$4,498 each additional week

Commuter Students

- **Includes:** lunch, academic course, excursions, programming from 9am to 5pm, Monday-Friday
- **Excludes:** lodging, breakfast, dinner, weekend excursions*
 - Weekend excursions can be added on for \$125 per day
- **Price:** \$2,498 first week \$1,998 each additional week

- Application fee: Starting at \$99 (mandatory, non-refundable)
- Course supplements \$250 tuition (mandatory): Emergency Medicine

Student Life

Students will live and study in St. Stephen's House, one of the former six Permanent Private Halls at the University of Oxford. Housed in a former monastery in a residential area, students will get the true feel of what it's like to live and learn in a traditional Academic Community, with the sites of Oxford at their fingertips.



Seminar-Style Courses

Our Oxford courses feature an intimate, seminar-style design with small class sizes. This close-knit setting encourages every student to lead detailed discussions and connect personally with leading academics, fostering a collaborative atmosphere ideal for high-level learning.



Lodging and Meals

St. Stephen's House is set up like a quintessential English college. Each dorm room is unique in its own way; although there are doubles, most rooms are single. All rooms have a sink and some rooms have an en-suite bath, but the majority have access to hallway toilets and showers. Our residential staff will be living amongst students. Breakfast and lunch will be in the dining hall, with most dinners off-site. Dinner on the last night of the program will be a traditional formal meal! All dietary restrictions can be accommodated.
