1-Week Course

This course is one week long, and you can extend your experience to as many as four weeks by adding additional one-week courses.

Program Highlights

- Write original poetry and prose inspired by Oxford's historic colleges, gardens and literary landmarks
- Experience Oxford-style tutorials with small group discussions and personalized feedback from Oxford-affiliated writers and scholars
- Visit the Lamb and Flag pub where Lewis and Tolkien met, explore the historic Ashmolean Museum and walk through locations that inspired famous British authors
- Analyze classic and contemporary British literature while studying in one of the world's most prestigious literary settings
- Develop your creative voice through daily writing practice and peer workshops
- Learn about academic and career pathways in writing, publishing and English literature

Academic Program Overview

Are you passionate about reading, writing and exploring the literary world? This summer, immerse yourself in Oxford's legendary literary heritage by studying and creating literature in the city that inspired C.S. Lewis, J.R.R. Tolkien and Oscar Wilde.

Experience the traditional Oxford tutorial system while exploring British literary history, creative writing, poetry and prose analysis, narrative structure, literary criticism and the art of storytelling.



Excursions

Connect with Oxford-affiliated writers, poets and literature scholars. Visit the historic Ashmolean Museum, the historic Lamb and Flag pub where C.S. Lewis and J.R.R. Tolkien shared their manuscripts, Oxford college gardens and other literary landmarks that have inspired generations of writers.

Sarah Frideswide is a veteran of the British Army who has a First Class degree in Literature and Creative Writing and a Masters with Distinction in Creative Writing from Oxford Bookes University. Her poetry has been published by OSP Review, Dust Poetry and lamb. She is a speaker at the 2026 Bournemouth Writing Festival. She was selected for the 2025 Poetry School Free Reads Scheme and has been mentored by Rishi Dastidar. She writes fiction and poetry. Her first poetry pamphlet is forthcoming and she is the author of One-Armed Nick and the Nuns of Osyth on Substack.

- **Price:** \$2,498 first week, \$1,998 for each additional week

- **Application fee:** Starting at \$99 (mandatory, non-refundable)

Course Structure

There are five 4-hour class sessions over the one-week course. Students have class from 9am-1pm, Monday-Friday. Our intimate, seminar-style courses in Oxford offer small class sizes that foster close-knit collaboration and active discussion with leading academics. Afternoons are dedicated to students' course-specific academic excursion, guest speaker or activity.
