Residential Students

- Price: \$5,398

Commuter Students

- Includes: lunch, academic course, excursions, programming from 9am to 6pm, Monday-Friday
- Excludes: lodging, breakfast, dinner, weekend excursions
 - Weekend excursions can be added on for \$125 per day
- Price: \$3,198

Supplements:

- Application fee: \$99 (mandatory, non-refundable)
- Nursing and Veterinary Medicine course supplement: \$250 tuition (mandatory)

Student Life

Whether on East or West campus, students will feel the sense of community and belonging as if they were a Duke undergrad. Duke's campus is known for its beautiful communal green spaces and natural surroundings, most notably, Sarah P. Duke Gardens which includes over 50 acres of specialized gardens in the heart of campus. While students will enjoy the on-campus amenities, they will also have the opportunity to explore Ninth Street and surrounding in-boundary areas. The Ninth Street district is a popular neighborhood near campus where students enjoy dining out, shopping, trying new cuisines, and getting a feel for the undergrad experience with their new friends.



Lodging and Meals

At Duke, students can expect to be housed in a traditional style dorm room which they shared with one roommate and use a communal hall bathroom. Floors are gender-segregated with bathrooms, including multiple toilets and showers, on both ends of the hall. Dorm rooms include an extra-long twin sized bed, desk and chair, and standalone wardrobe closet. All residential halls have a surrounding courtyard, are air conditioned, and include common rooms and lounges making it a comfortable place to hang out. Students will have their daily three meals at one of Duke's student dining halls.
