

INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

Highlights

- Learn to address global issues by investigating and researching the relationships between various nationstates, cultures, and intergovernmental organizations such as the United Nations and other NGOs.
- Debate international conflicts, seek solutions, and learn to negotiate and reach successful conflict resolution.
- Collaborate and strategize with students and staff from different countries to develop new approaches to global issues.
- Participate in a Model UN simulation and receive feedback from professionals in the field.

Real World Insights

This course gives students the tools to understand the various aspects of international affairs by learning how the world works. Topics covered include foreign policy, international law, diplomacy, human rights, and environmental issues. Throughout the summer, students will visit the Embassy of the Republic of Kosovo and the Embassy of Ukraine, offering unique opportunities for firsthand engagement. Students will meet with the ambassador at the Embassy of Kosovo, while at the Embassy of Ukraine, they will engage with the First Secretary of Public & Cultural Diplomacy. These visits provide valuable insights into the diplomatic relations of both countries with the U.S., E.U., and neighboring nations.

POLITICS & PUBLIC POLICY



Highlights

- Learn about the role that political parties, public opinion, and special interest groups can have in shaping behavior and policies at the federal, state, and local levels.
- Partake in a Senate simulation where you will champion your ideas and passions into legislation to become law, moving it from Committee to the Senate floor.
- Visit policymakers and think tanks to learn more about careers in the field.

Real World Insights

Students will immerse themselves in the American political system as they draft legislation representing their goals. They will use their power of persuasion to convince others of the value of their bill and move it from their committee to the Senate floor. Last year, students met with various politicians and visited the White House campus, the Supreme Court, and the US Capitol.

TRIAL LAW

Highlights

- Assume the role of trial attorney as you try a challenging case by researching evidence, preparing and crafting arguments, and preparing and examining witnesses.
- Experience a unique view of the legal profession that is personal and insightful from seasoned lawyers or legal scholars.
- Explore all roles of a challenging case acting as defense attorneys, prosecutors, witnesses, jurors, or judge.
- Visit a courthouse and sit in on an active trial.

Real World Insights

Spend time with a judge, attorneys, and other legal experts. This is a rare opportunity to sit in a courtroom, ask personal questions, and hear professionals discuss their journeys from law school to where they are today. Previous excursions included the Superior Court of the District of Columbia.

MEDICINE & HEALTHCARE TRACK



EMERGENCY MEDICINE

Highlights

- Discover practical skills such as suturing, stopping a bleed and taking vital signs.
- Gain valuable insight into diverse educational and career opportunities in medicine and healthcare.
- Participate in a "mass casualty incident" where you work against the clock to save as many people as possible.
- Train in a medical simulation lab where medical students refine their life-saving skills, such as intubation and CPR.

Real World Insights

If your vision of your future self includes a white coat and stethoscope, scrubs and a heart monitor, the best way to launch a career in emergency medicine is to gain practical, hands-on life saving skills. To put those skills to use, students will have the opportunity to visit a simulation center such as the Trinity Washington University nursing laboratory and Simulation lab in Washington DC.



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Program Types & Tuition

Residential

MIDDLE SCHOOL BUSINESS



- Work in teams to create a new business venture and develop a sales and marketing plan to pitch their venture to investors and mentors.

Real World Insights

Students in this program will become part of a new company they devise and will work in teams on various aspects of the new business. The program culminates in a Shark Tankstyle pitch presentation with industry veterans as their potential mock investors.

MIDDLE SCHOOL MEDICINE

- Discover critical techniques in emergency medicine such as setting a splint and performing CPR.
- Work in teams as you research, diagnose, and develop a treatment plan for a "patient".
- Triage cases from a "mass casualty" in a simulated emergency room simulation.
- Learn alongside medical professionals and gain behind-the-scenes knowledge of the emergency room.

Overview

Imagine being able to set a splint, stop a bleed, and perform CPR as a middle school student! Students will learn medical techniques through age-appropriate simulations and guided lessons. In addition, they'll work with small groups to research a patient's history and symptoms, create a diagnosis based on findings, and develop a treatment plan
