Academic Program Overview

Over the course of the program, students will complete multiple creative writing projects which will be combined into a portfolio. Along the way, they will explore mentor texts and choose one area to create a larger creative project. By using an experiential learning approach, students will quickly engage in the topic, and the instructor introduces the underlying theory and concepts as students tackle these issues while creating original stories.

Guest Speakers & Excursions

Previous excursions included a visit to the Mark Twain House where students took a tour of this iconic author's home. Beyond the tour, the museum offered activities and educational programs that illuminated Twain's literary legacy and provided information about his life and times.

- **Residential Students:** \$4,998
